Congratulations to the members of the class of 1954.

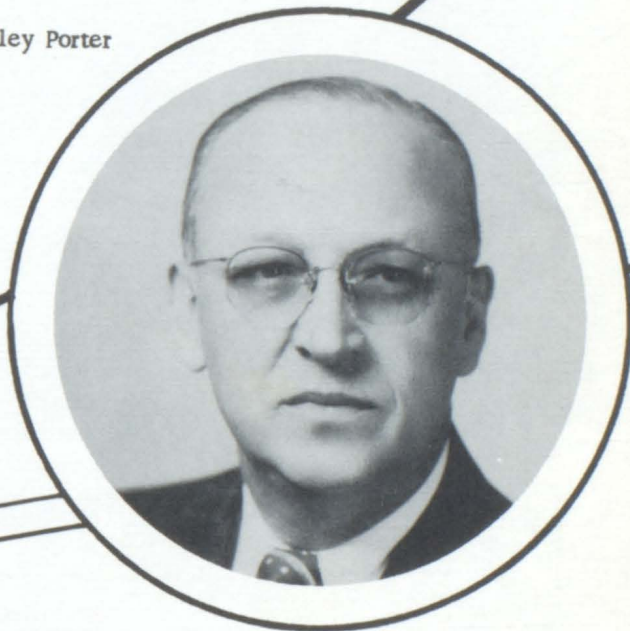
We of Greenwood know that you have many abilities and that you have already achieved many fine things individually and for our schools.

We know also that you will continue to exert your leadership for things that are right and progressive as you go through life attaining higher goals in your respective fields of endeavor.

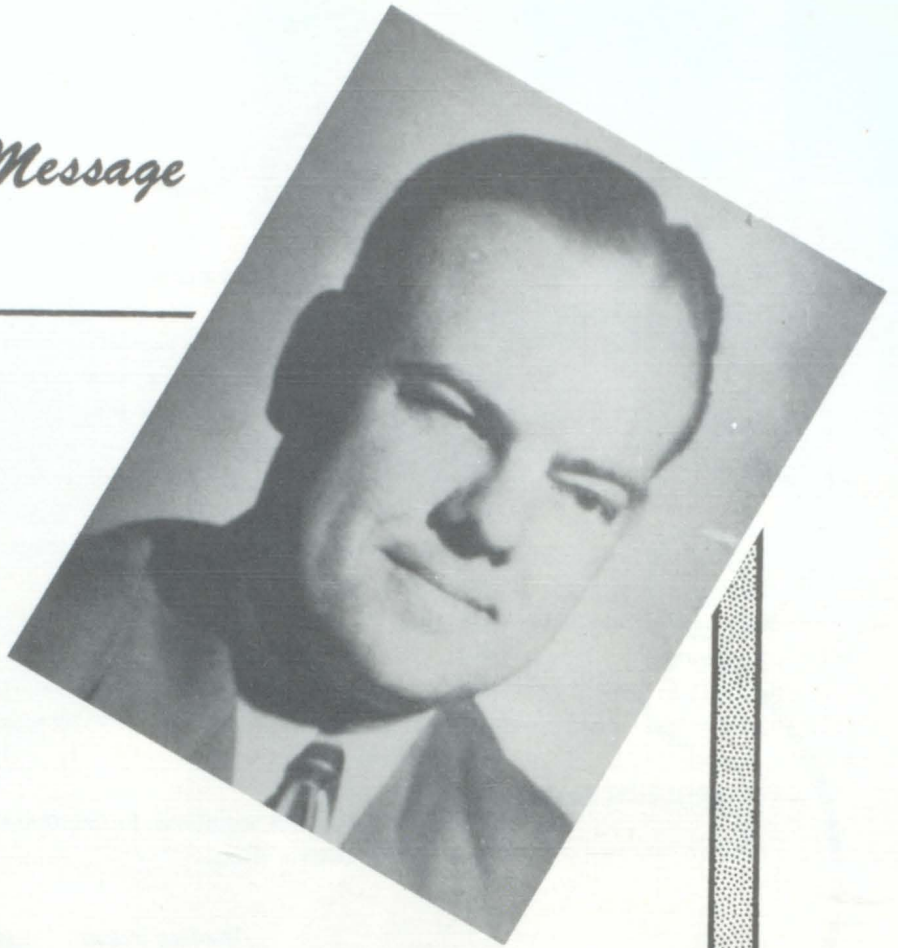
It is our hope that you will always remember that you are inseparable from Greenwood and that we will always be interested in you and your success and well-being.

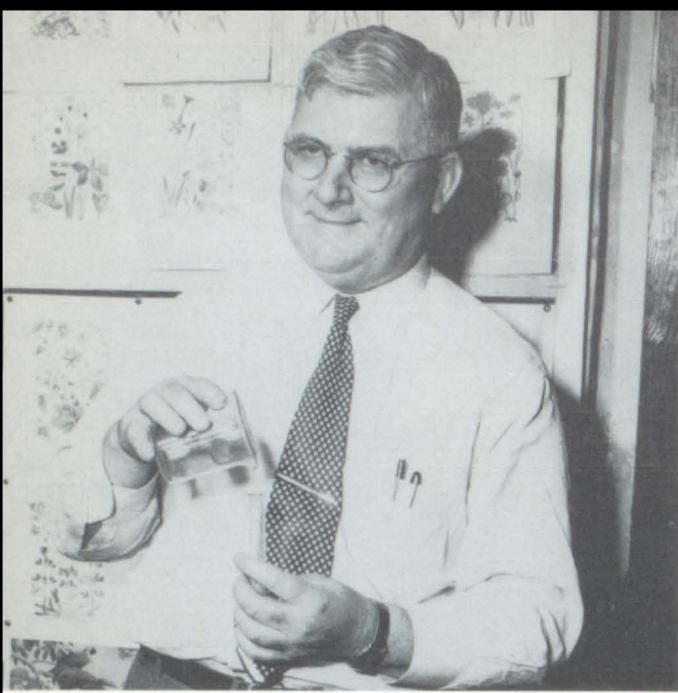

And we think that is just fine.

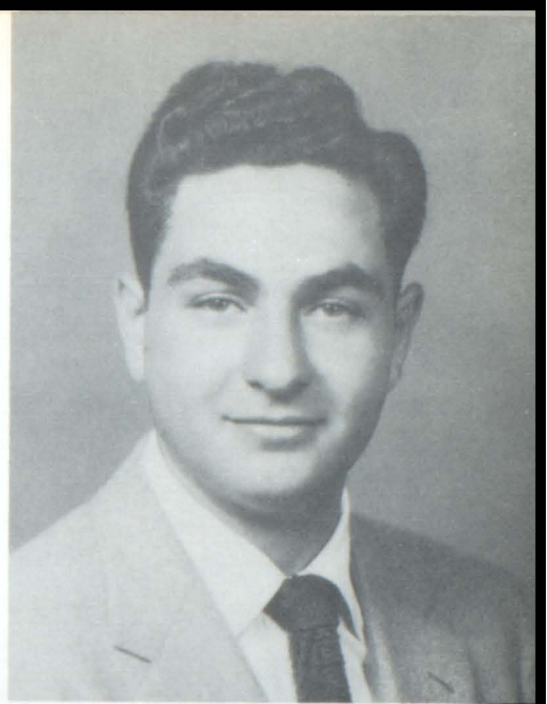
Eddie Peachin is our class brain,

And hope we have some more.

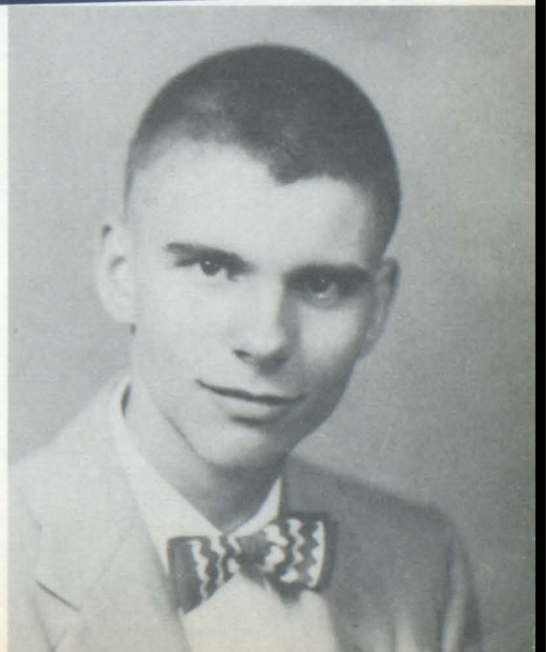
