






Student Life is the hammer and chisel with which we sculpture our personalities and social lives. This enables us to be good, wholesome school citizens.

The Greenwood Woodmen tromped the Mooresville Pioneers to add to the excitement of the evening.






"Sayanora" Places Students In A Dream World

Biology is a course that is required of sophomores. Many interesting facets of our world are discovered in this class-especially the interior of a frog.














