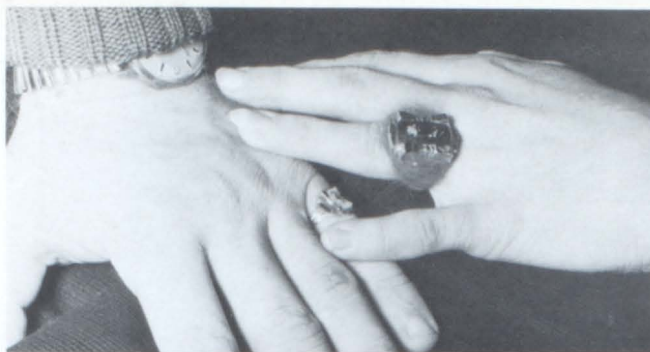

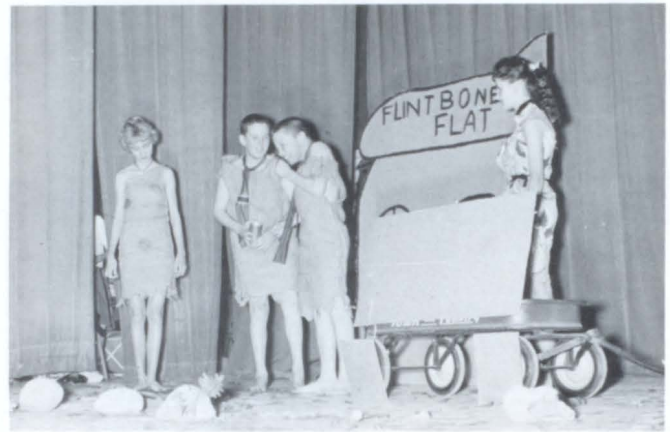

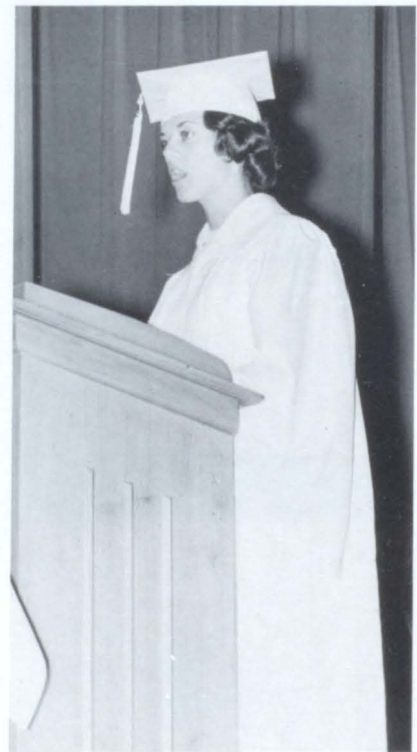

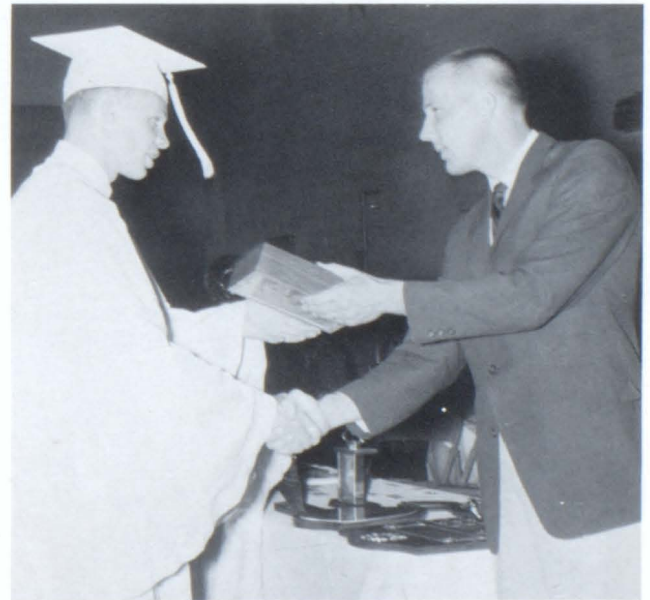

At Greenwood High School we begin our science training early. In junior high, general science is a required course.

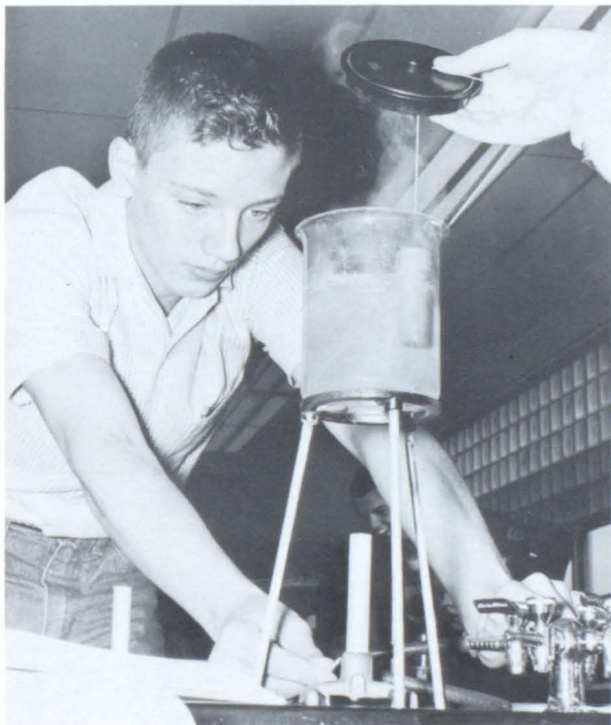
As freshmen, we must take one semester of health and safety. This course broadens our knowledge of basic health principles.

Biology is a course that is required of sophomores. Many interesting facets of our world are discovered in this class-- especially the interior of a frog.

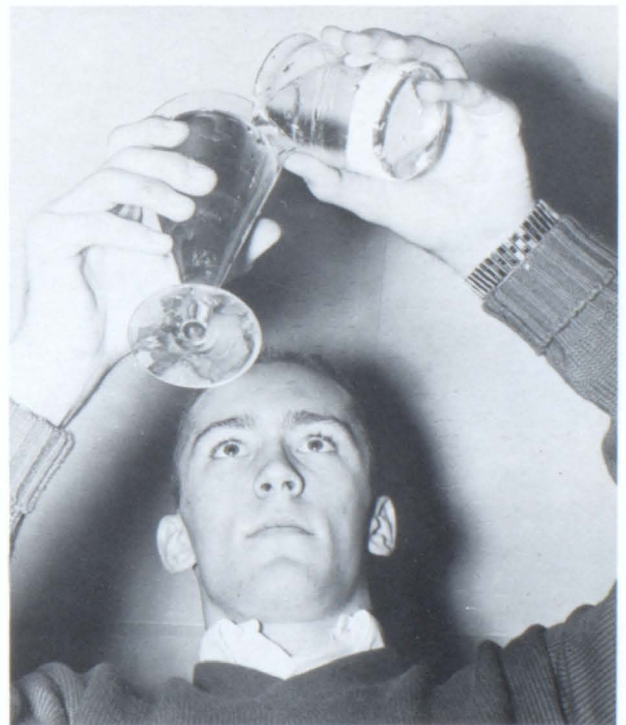

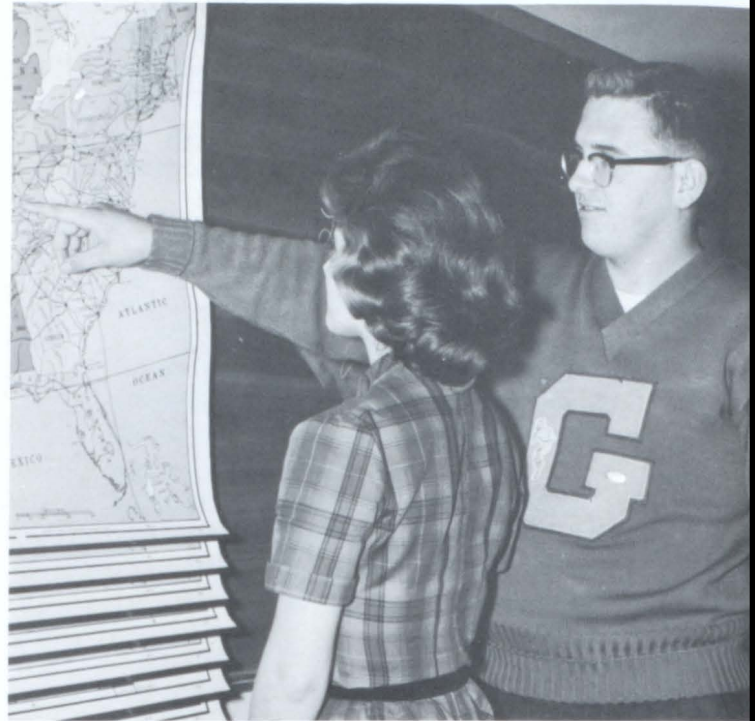

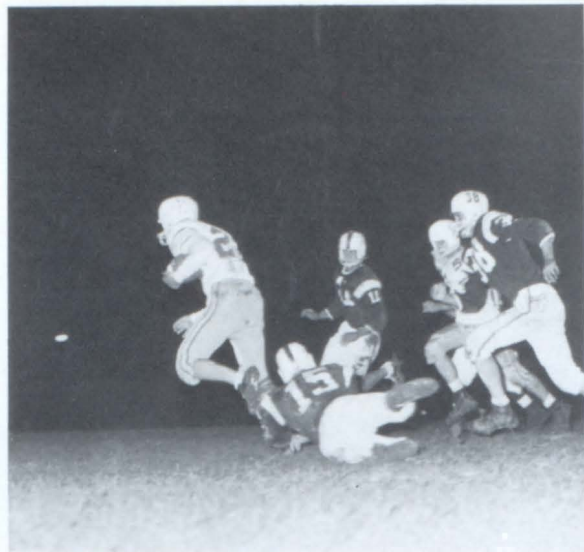

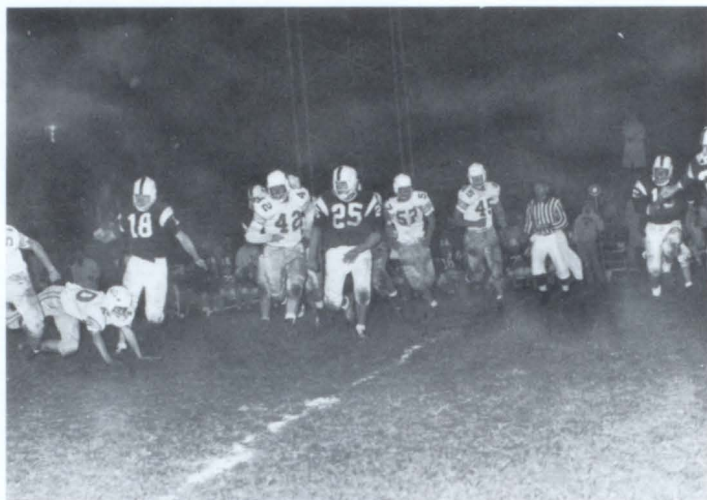

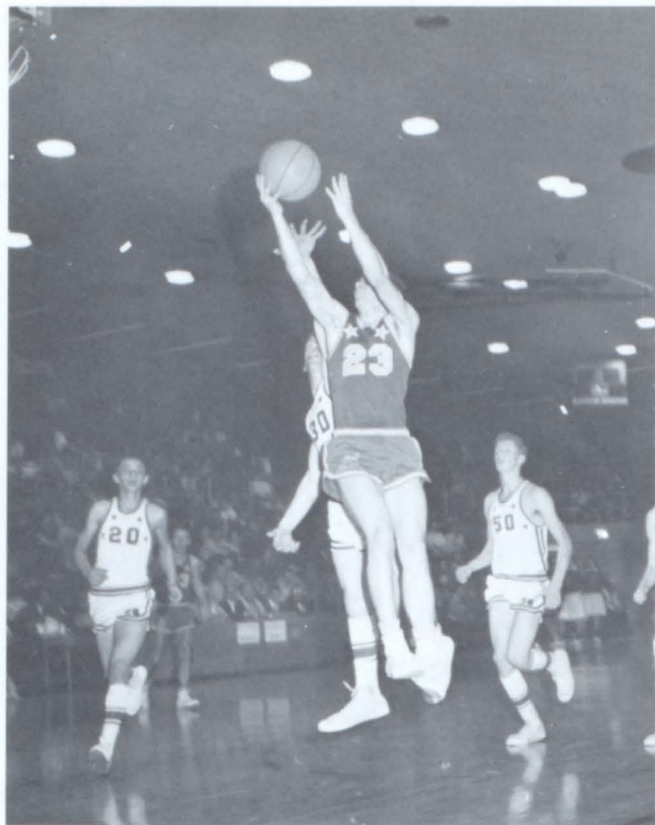
