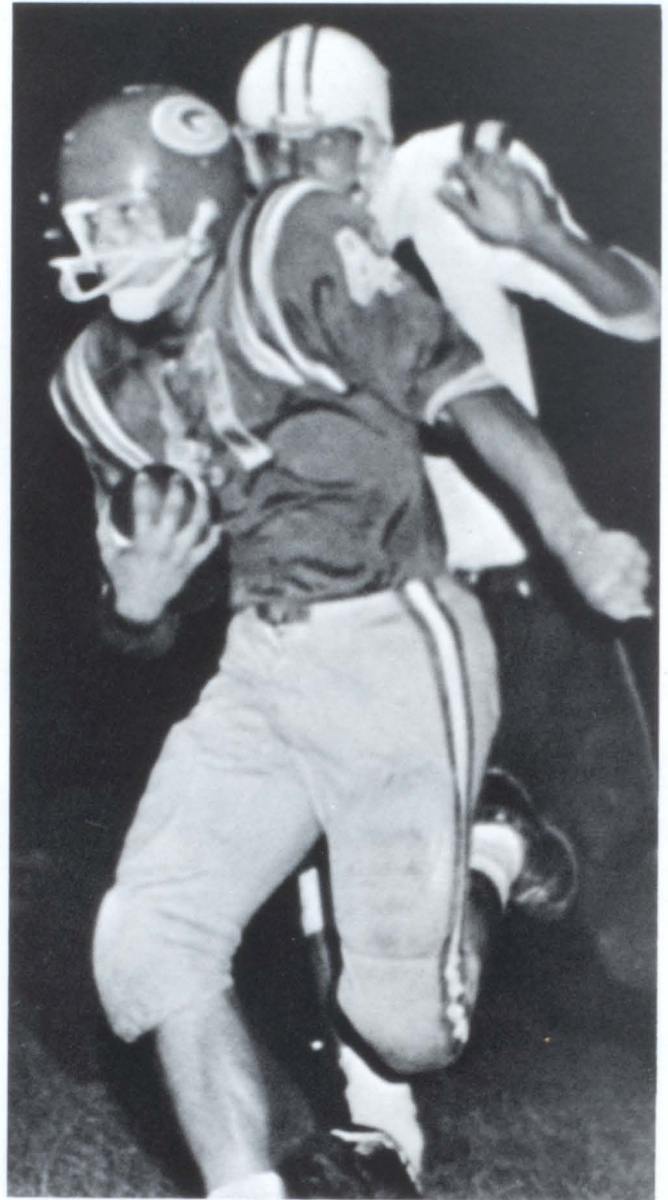

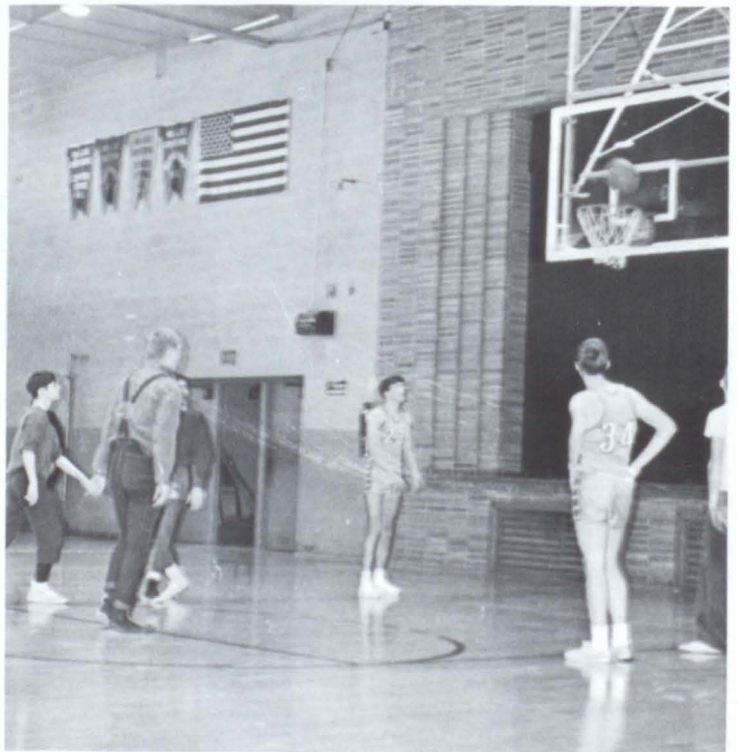

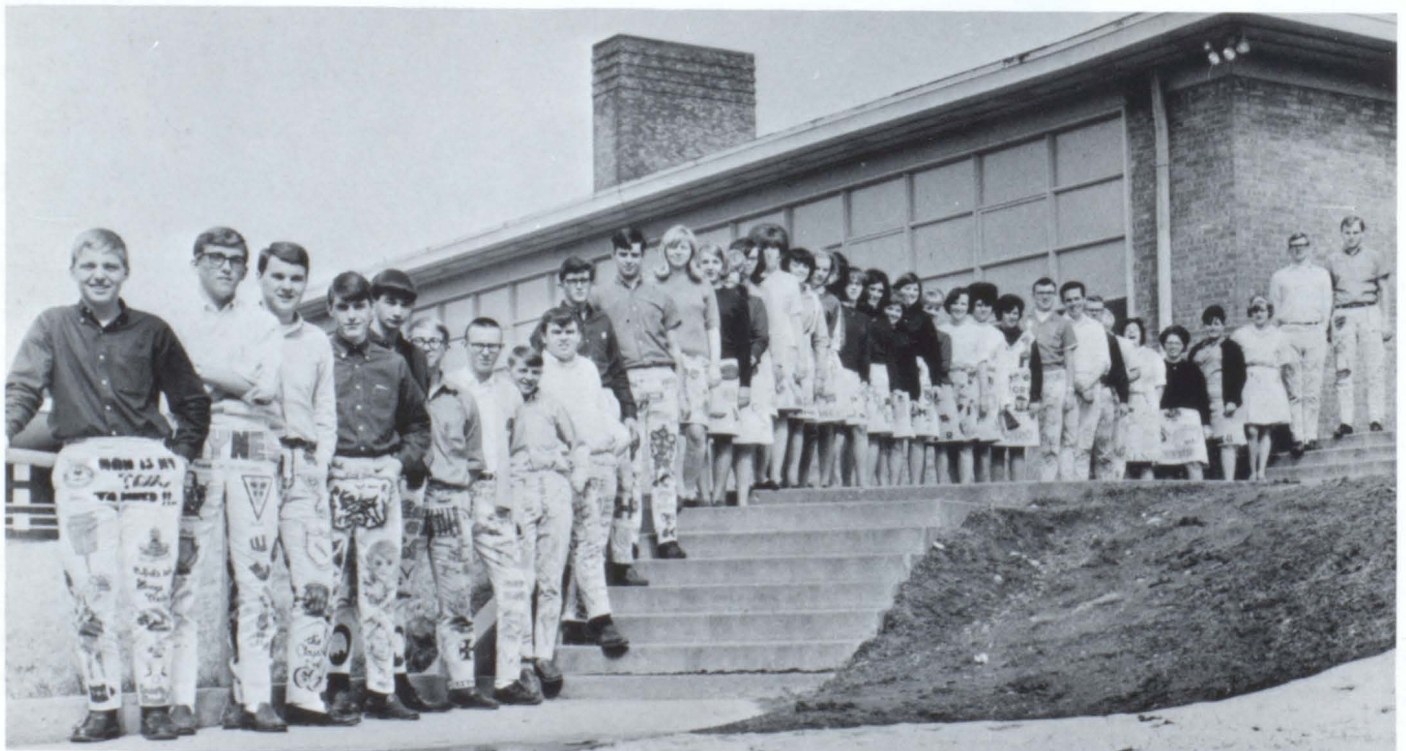

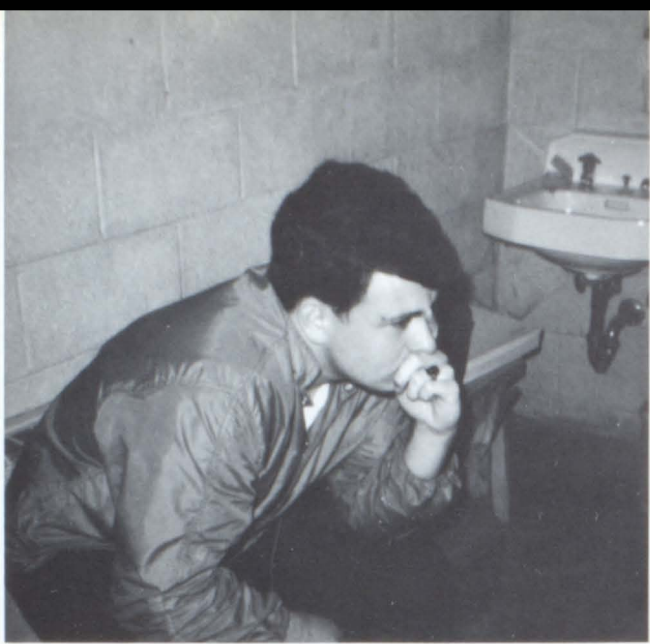

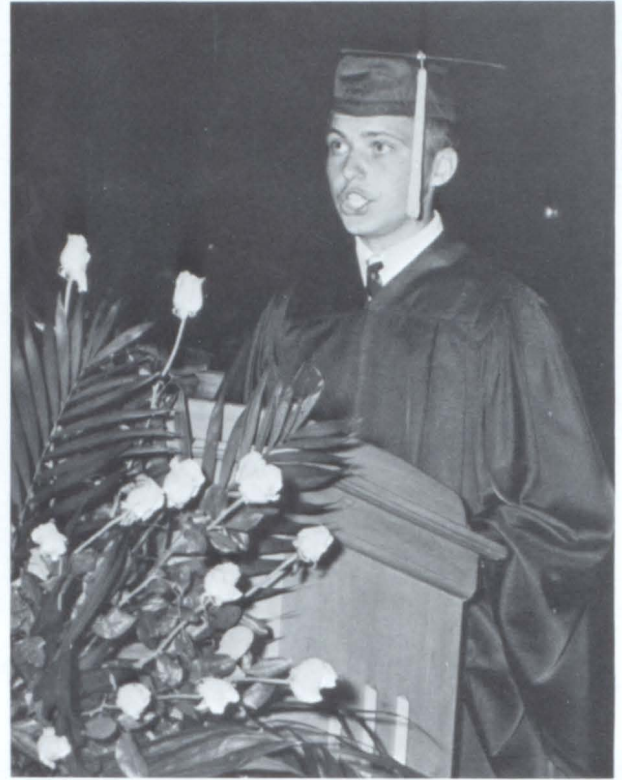

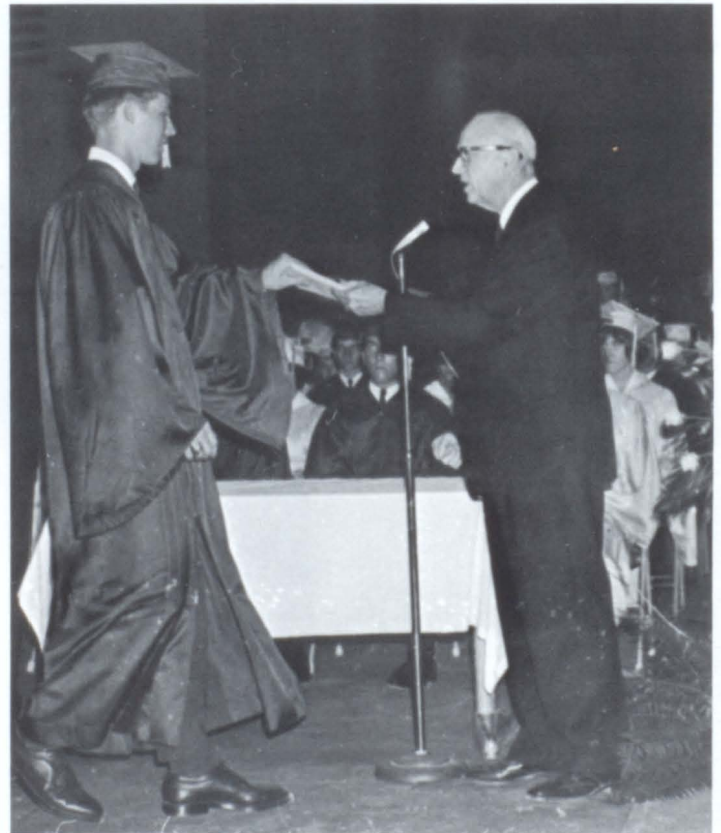

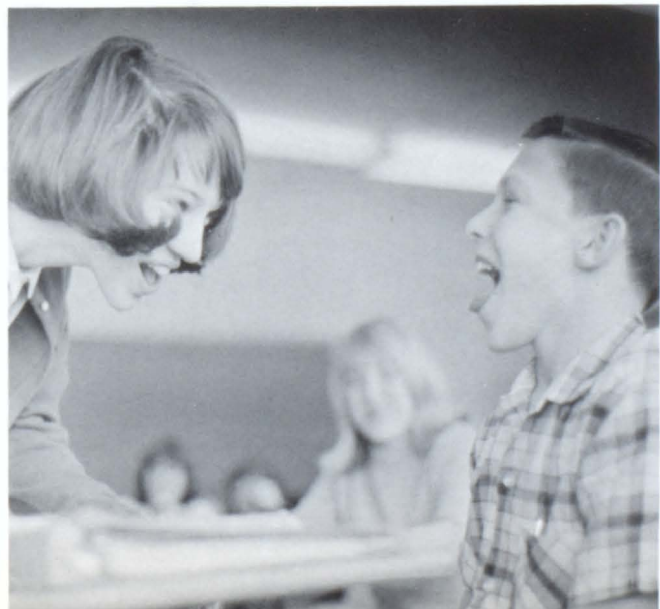
Science Paves the Way to the Future

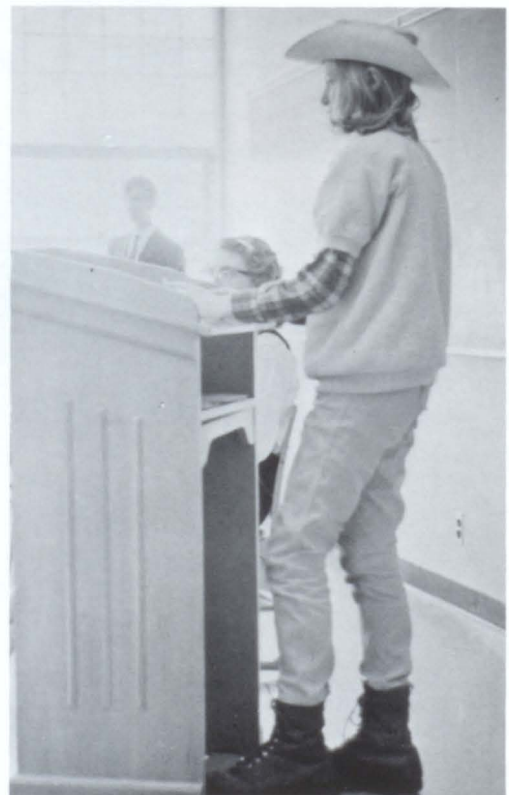

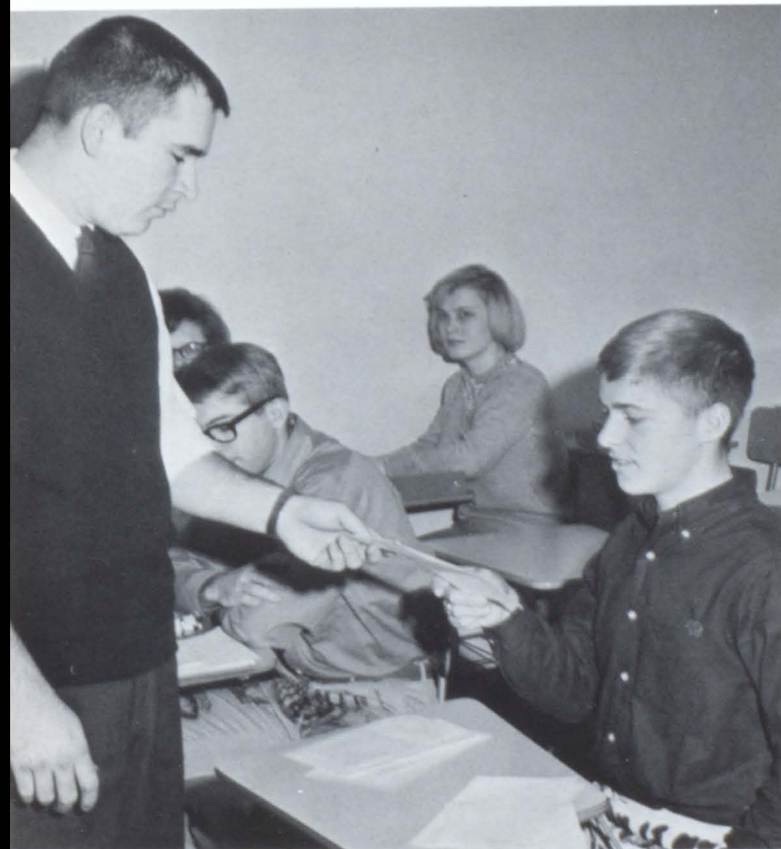

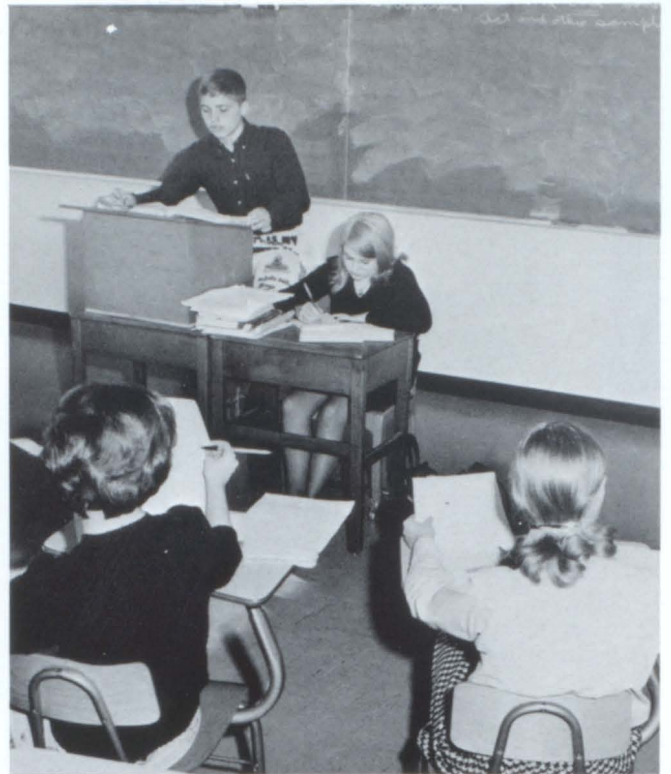

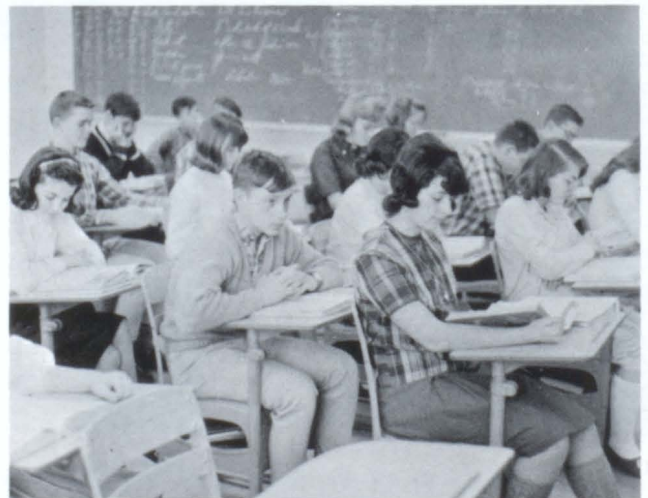
History Provides Stepping Stones to the Future

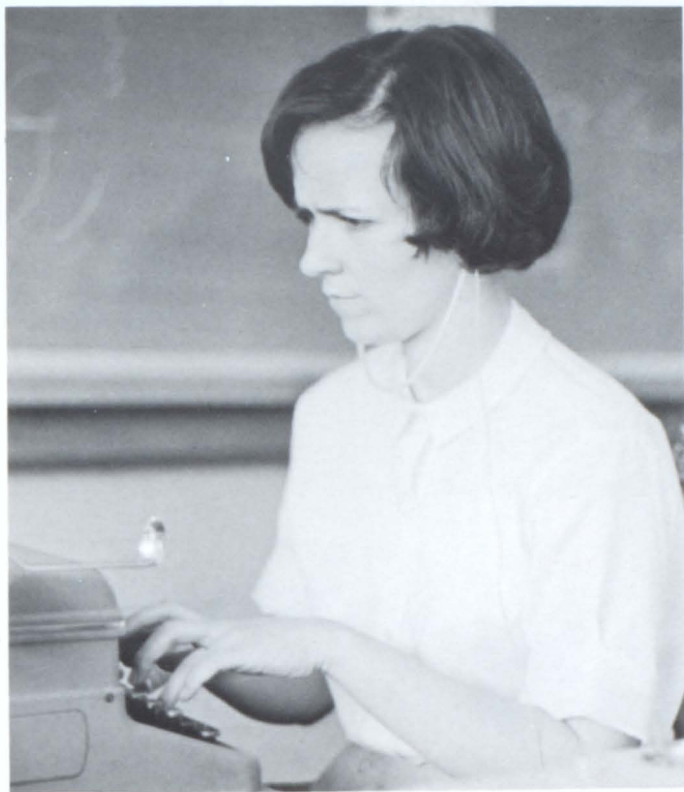

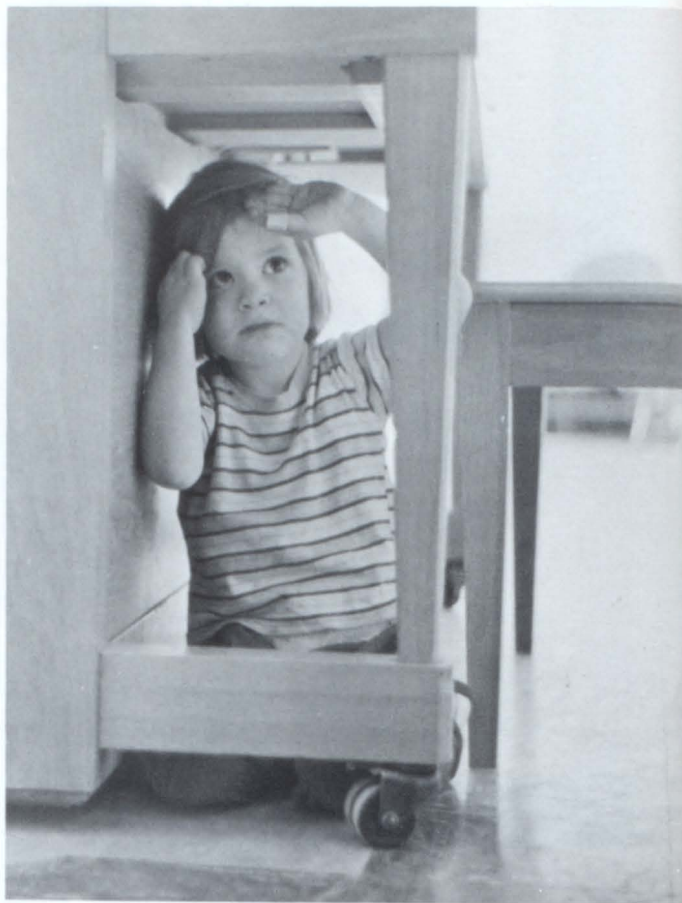

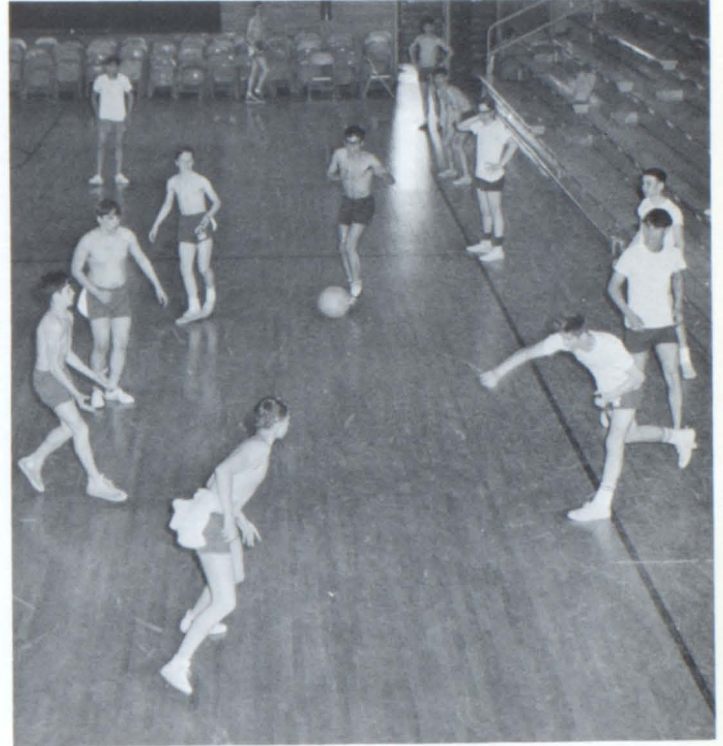

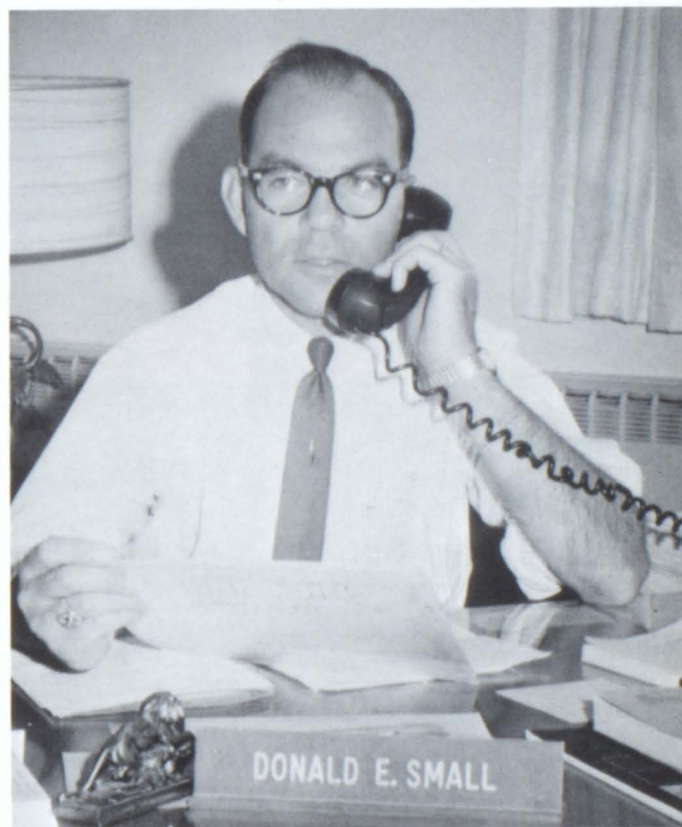

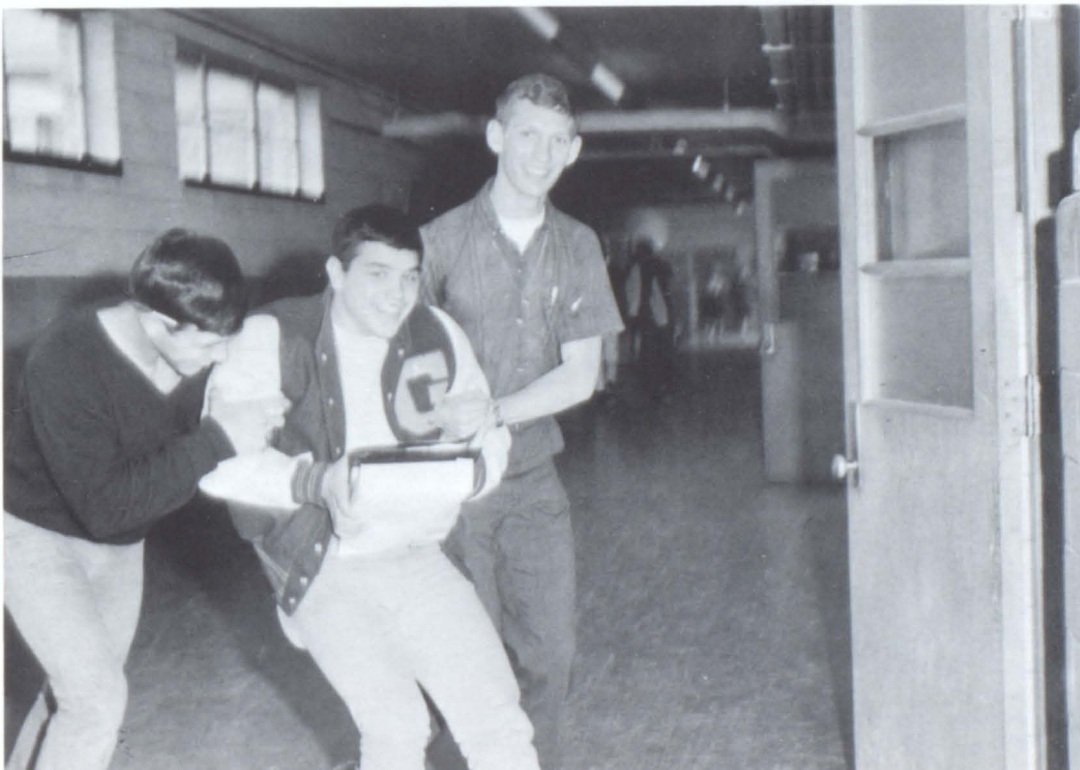

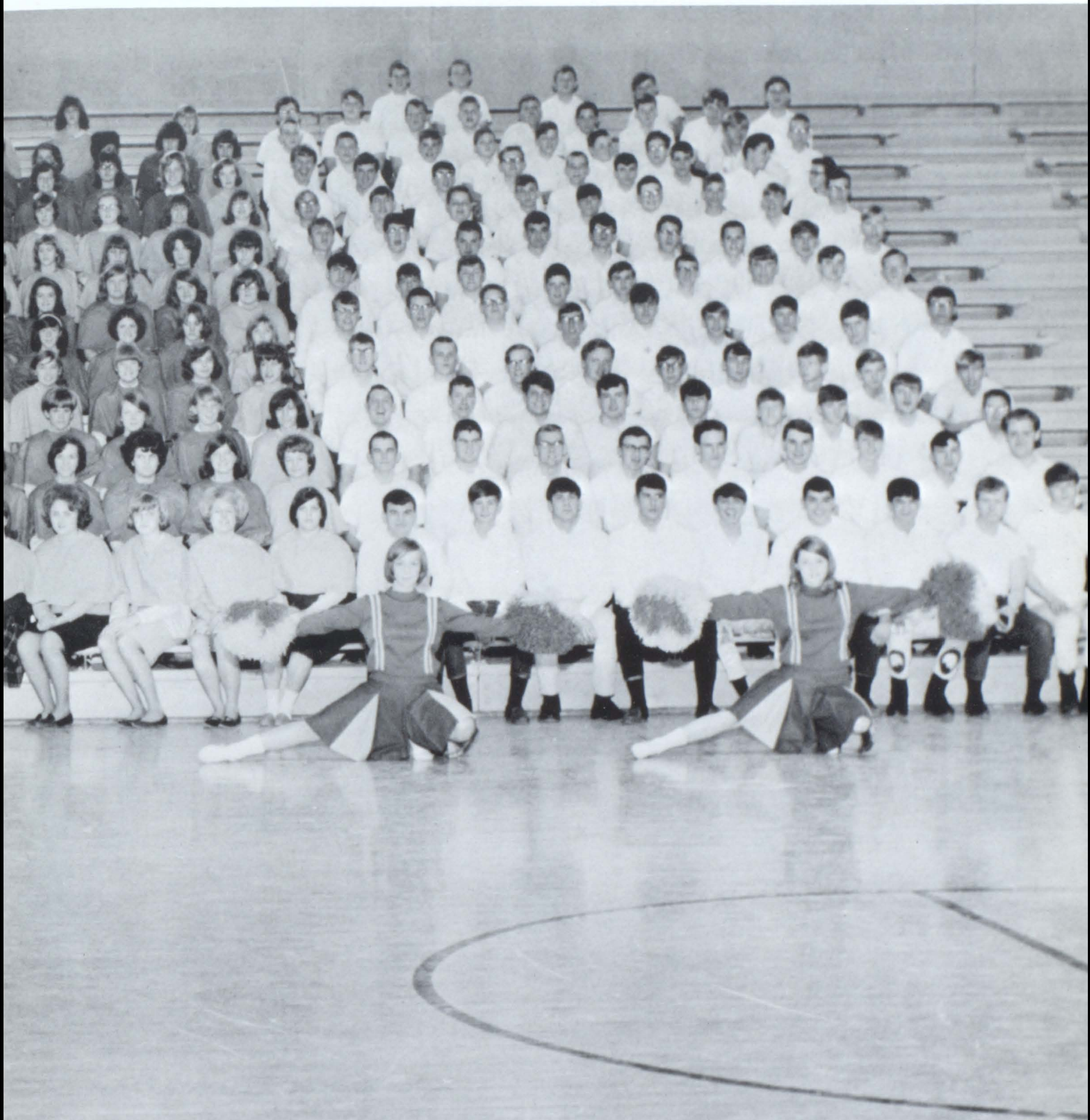

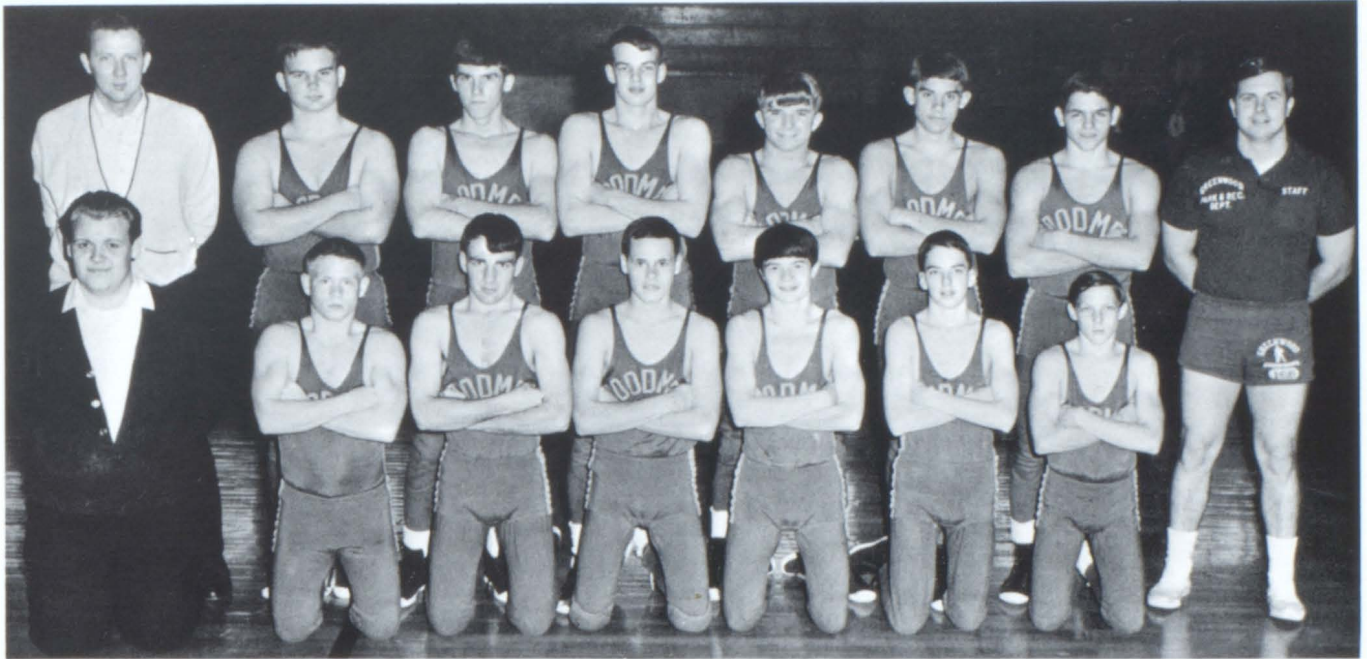

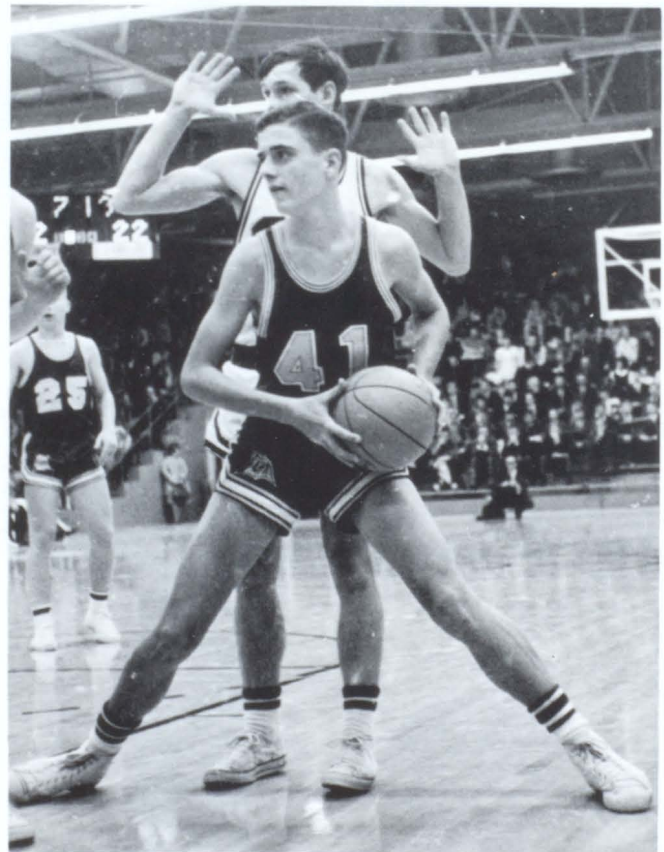

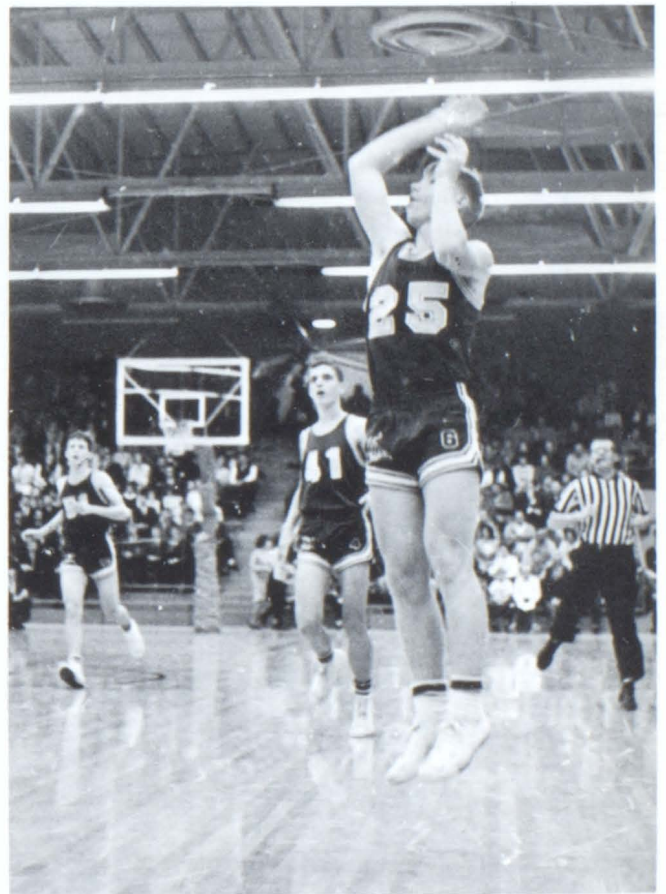

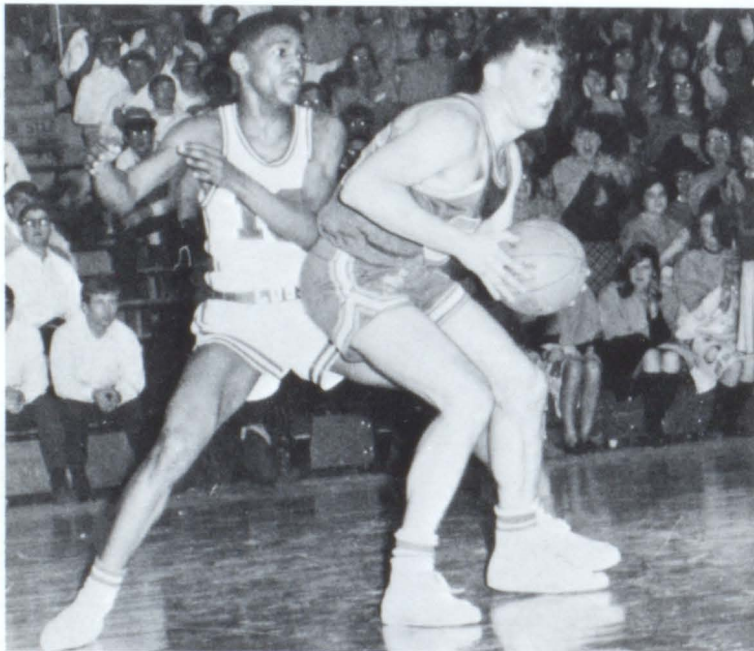

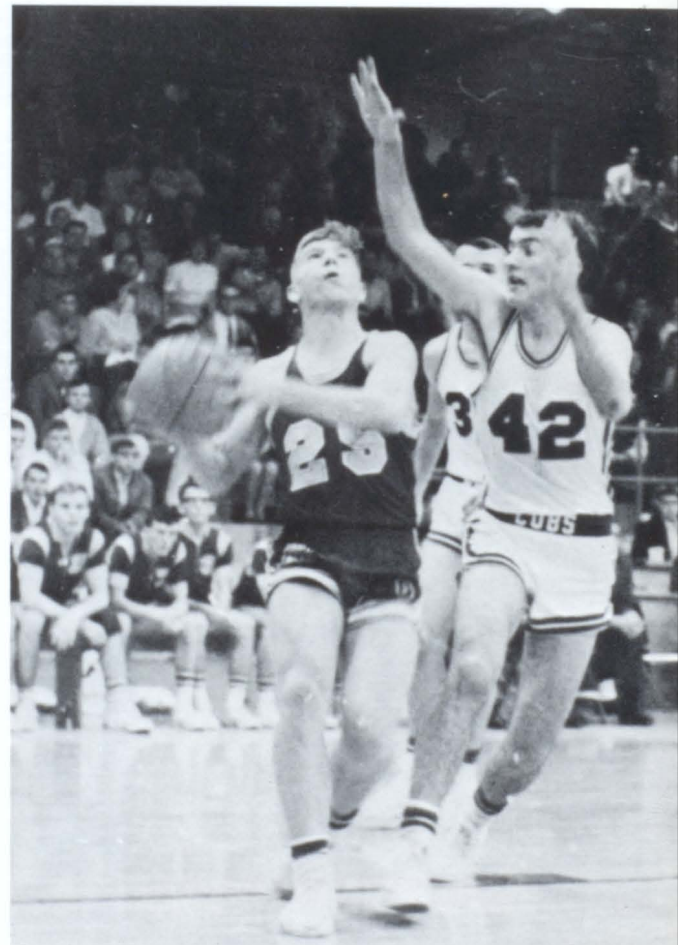
