



and I don't know.


But I do know there are accidents planned or perpetrated that come upon us like an early fog and make a difference.


### 'Mac' writes plays







year included rubber masks, not just at Halloween, gaucho pant, high boots, and new rock groups.


The fad that never changes is going out to lunch and not getting caught. McDonalds was the most popular spot. And after the game it was Pizza Hut.










### "To accomplish great things"






## Problem solving



Central 9 Vocational Technical school offered a valuable learning experience for Juniors and Seniors from nine school systems. The school offered a wide variety of subjects including Health Occupation, Secretarial Work, Radio and TV Repair, Printing, Auto Mechanics, and Horticulture. While requiring the usual classroom phase, the courses were designed in order to allow each student first-

hand experience in his particular field of study. Students spent three hours in either the morning or the afternoon sessions. Counselors chose those students who were best qualified for Central 9. Students studied there for either one or two years.







#### Artists vary methods








#### **Business**

## Fitness stressed







#### Social Sc.
